

Construction	Recombinant Human Thymic stromal lymphopoietin is produced by our Mammalian expression system and the target gene encoding Tyr29-Gln159 is expressed with a human lgG1 Fc tag at the C-terminus.

Formulation	Lyophilized from a 0.2 $\mu m$ filtered solution of PBS, pH7.4
Shipping	The product is shipped at ambient temperature. Upon receipt, store it immediately at the temperature listed below.
Stability&Storage	Lyophilized protein should be stored at $\leq -20^{\circ}$ C, stable for one year after receipt. Reconstituted protein solution can be stored at 2-8°C for 2-7 days. Aliquots of reconstituted samples are stable at $\leq -20^{\circ}$ C for 3 months.
Reconstitution	Always centrifuge tubes before opening. Do not mix by vortex or pipetting. It is not recommended to reconstitute to a concentration less than 100µg/ml. Dissolve the lyophilized protein in distilled water. Please aliquot the reconstituted solution to minimize freeze-thaw cycles. Always centrifuge tubes before opening. # Alternative NamesThymic stromal lymphopoietin; Thymic stroma-derived lymphopoietin; TSLPBackgroundThymic stromal lymphopoietin (TSLP) is a protein belonging to the cytokine family,<br/>contains 140 amino acids. It is known to play an important role in the maturation<br/>of T cell populations through activation of antigen presenting cells. TSLP induces<br/>the release of T-cell-attracting chemokines from monocytes and, in particular,<br/>enhances the maturation of CD11c+ dendritic cells. It can induce allergic<br/>inflammation by directly activating mast cells. TSLP is produced mainly by non-<br/>hematopoietic cells such as fibroblasts, epithelial cells and different types of<br/>stromal or stromal-like cells. These cells are located in regions where TSLP activity<br/>is required.
